2019 Summer Schedule

Summer classes are available at Fresno City College in 4, 6, 8 and 10-week sessions. Apply online for these courses at webadvisor.scccd.edu. NEW, TRANSFER AND RETURNING FORMER STUDENTS must file an application for admission in order to receive a registration date. CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS will receive their Summer enrollment materials beginning in March. For best selection of classes, students are encouraged to enroll on their assigned registration dates. Specific dates for the summer sessions are listed below. For all other summer session classes, final add and drop dates will vary by class. Check with your class instructor or the Admissions and Records Office for add/drop dates of a specific class.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE ON DROP DATES AND OTHER STATE-MANDATED DEADLINES It is the student's responsibility to comply with the following statemandated deadlines.

Fee Refund - State code defines the drop-deadlines required to qualify for fee refund/reversals for Summer Session classes as on or before 10 percent of the duration of the class. Check with your Business Office for the deadlines.

Pass/No Pass - Students must request Pass/No Pass status (or cancel a previous request for Pass/No Pass status) on or before 30 percent of the duration of the class. Check with your Admissions and Records Office for the deadline on your class.

No Record (DR) - Classes dropped before 20 percent of the duration of the class will not be reflected on the student's transcript. Check with your instructor for the deadline applicable to your class.

Withdrawal (W) - A student will be assigned a grade of "W" for classes dropped on or after 20 percent of the duration of the class, up to and including 50 percent of the duration of the class. After the 50 percent point, the student must receive a letter grade other than a "W" (i.e., A, B, C, D, F, I, P, NP). Check with your instructor for the deadline applicable to your class.

WHO CAN ENROLL

You may enroll in classes at Fresno City College if you are a high school graduate or the equivalent (GED or CHSPE) or, if not a high school graduate, you are at least 18 years old. Also, if you are a currently enrolled high school junior or senior, you are welcome to take classes with permission from a parent and your high school principal. Contact your high school counselor for details about the High School Enrichment Program or visit www.fresnocitycollege.edu/hse

If you have never attended Fresno City College (new or transfer student) or have been away for two or more semesters (returning former student), you must first complete an application for admission. See page 5 for the "Steps to Success." Applications are available online at www.fresnocitycollege.edu/apply. Currently enrolled students do not have to reapply for admission.

After completing an online orientation and meeting with a counselor, students should check this schedule and select the courses in which they wish to enroll. Students must make sure they have reviewed the recommended course prerequisites listed (if any).

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Currently enrolled students can check their Registration eligibility on WebAdvisor beginning in March 2019. The Registration Eligibility screen will show his/her Summer/Fall assigned registration date and any holds that must be cleared prior to being allowed to register. Registration eligibility notices will also be emailed to his/her my.scccd.edu free email. If you have been away for two or more semesters, have never attended a State Center Community College District campus or center, or if you are a high school student, you must complete an admission application prior to being able to register for classes.

STEPS TO SUCCESS

Below you will find the steps to help you be ready for your first semester in college. Complete Steps 1-4 to be fully matriculated and be eligible to register during the preferred enrollment period.

Step 1: Apply for Admission & Set-up Your Student Account	 Apply online: visit http://www.fresnocitycollege.edu/apply to complete the CCCApply application for admission. You will receive an email 1-2 days after applying with your student ID number and login instructions. Log in to your student portal: wisit www.fresnocitycollege.edu and click on "My Portal". Once you log in to your student portal (see page 25), you can access your student email, Canvas, WebAdvisor, and other useful tools. Check your email daily as email is the primary way the college will communicate with you.
Step 2: New Student Orientation	Complete the Fresno City College Online Orientation through your student portal or at https://www.scccd.edu/orientation . It may take up to 2 business days to clear your orientation hold.
Step 3: Assessment/Placement	 Math and English placement tests are no longer required under AB 705 legislation. For students whose first language is not English, students can take the English for Multi-Lingual Students (EMLS) placement test to determine which course is most appropriate for their skill level. Call (559) 442-8280 or visit www.fresnocitycollege.edu/assessmentcenter for testing information.
Step 4: See a Counselor (Complete SEP)	 New Students: After your application has processed, you will be eligible to receive advising to complete your Student Educational Plan Abbreviated (SEPA). Contact the College Relations Office at (559) 442-8225 to set up an appointment with a counselor. Returning Students: To complete or update your Student Educational Plan (SEP), call the Counseling Department at (559) 442-8226 for an appointment or go online at http://www.fresnocitycollege.edu/counseling.
Step 5: Financial Aid/Scholarships	 Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov or the California Dream Act application at dream.csac.ca.gov. If you need assistance, visit the Financial Aid Lab in the Library, Room 123. To apply for scholarships, view important deadlines, and find the financial aid contact information visit http://www.fresnocitycollege.edu/financialaid
Step 6: Register for Classes	 You can register in the following ways: (1) Online using WebAdvisor (located in your Student Portal or (2) On campus in the Admissions & Records office (Student Services building, 1st floor). Before you register, make sure all prerequisite requirements have been met. If the prerequisite was taken and successfully completed outside of the SCCCD campus sites, bring your transcripts indicating the passing grade to the Counseling Department for review.
Step 7: Follow Up	 Pay Your Student Fees. See fee payments at http://www.fresnocitycollege.edu/fees Get Your FCC Photo ID (optional) - Go to the Student Activities Office located next to the Cafeteria, cost is \$5 per semester. Get Your Textbooks - Preview what textbooks are required and purchase or rent from the FCC Bookstore which is located across the Cafeteria: www.fresnocitycollege.edu/bookstore Attend your classes on the first day of school - you may be dropped from class if you fail to attend the first class meeting. Follow up with a counselor to develop a comprehensive SEP (SEPC).

STUDENT ACADEMIC STANDING

State education code requires students to maintain satisfactory progress while enrolled at a community college. Students who do not make satisfactory progress by completing courses and/or achieving satisfactory grades will be placed on progress or academic probation respectively. Progress Probation - student has attempted and accumulated a total of 12 or more units for which the entries of "W", "NP", "NC", and "I" are recorded reaches or exceeds fifty percent (50%). Academic Probation - student has attempted and accumulated a total of 12 or more semester units for which the cumulative grade point average falls below 2.0 in all units which were graded on the basis of letter grades. Progress/Academic Dismissal - student will be subject to dismissal if in three consecutive semesters (semesters shall be considered consecutive on the basis of the student's enrollment exclusive of summer session) the student's percentage of units in which the entries of "W", "NP", "NC" and "I', were recorded reached or exceeded fifty percent (50%) OR student's cumulative grade point average was less than 2.0.

СРВР	Continued Probation per Board Policy: Student on probation (academic or progress), may not be dismissed if during the third consecutive semester of below satisfactory work the student maintains a semester GPA of 2.0 and completes more than 50% of the semester units attempted. Student must see a counselor and register in person at the Admission and Records Office. Requires a Work in Progress form for counselor signature at midterm.
DQP	Academic/Progress Dismissal Pending Approval: A Dismissal Appeal must be submitted, with all supporting documentation, by the published deadline. Student who do not submit an appeal with be dis-enrolled and required to SIT-OUT.
DQ1	First Disqualification: Student cannot enroll for a minimum of one year. Readmission Petition required.
DQ2	Second Disqualification: Student cannot enroll for minimum of one year. Readmission Petition required
DQ3	Third Disqualification: Student cannot enroll for a minimum of two year. Readmission Petition required

Registration Substitutes (Proxy Registration)

The Federal Family Education Rights and Privacy Act makes it illegal for the college to release a student's confidential educational records, including registration information, to anyone without written permission from the student. Therefore, if you are unable to register on your assigned date, you may either register at a later date or have someone else substitute for you provided the following procedure is observed.

YOUR SUBSTITUTE must have a written statement signed by you authorizing him/her to register on your behalf. Forms are available at the Admissions and Records Office. It is not necessary that your authorization be made on the form provided by the college; however, if you prepare your own statement, it must contain specific information. Contact the Admissions and Records Office for details.

YOUR SUBSTITUTE should also have your registration worksheet, a list of classes you wish to take (including several alternates) and sufficient funds to pay the necessary fees listed under Enrollment Fees on page 12.

Online Registration - WebAdvisor

Students in good standing, with no registration holds, can access WebAdvisor through the college portal. Visit www.fresnocitycollege.edu and click on "My Portal". Once you log in to your student portal you can access WebAdvisor, and other useful tools. Before logging in to WebAdvisor, complete the following steps:

- Be sure to study course descriptions in the college's catalog, or online, to ensure that prerequisites are satisfied.
- See a counselor for any assistance you need to clear a
 prerequisite taken in high school or at another college,
 academic standing other than GOOD, update your student
 education plan (SEP) or select classes.
- Clear any registration holds at the appropriate office (see registration holds on page 6).
- Each student is given a User ID; this is your last name combined with your 7-digit student ID number in the format lastname_student ID# (e.g. smith_0123456). If you do not remember your User ID, click on "What's My User ID?" for help.

Students are not sent a copy of any registration transactions or a class schedule when using WebAdvisor. Students can view and print a copy of their class schedule by clicking on "My Class Schedule" under the Academic Profile heading. Students are responsible for paying any fees due by the payment due date. Click on "Your Payment Due Date" under the Financial Information heading to determine when your fees are due. Steps of how to register online are provided on page 10.

Student Schedules

Students who register in person will receive a registration statement at the time of registration. The registration statement will also include the payment due date. Students are not sent a copy of any registration transactions or a class schedule when using WebAdvisor. Students can view and print a copy of their class schedule by clicking on "My Class Schedule" under the Academic Profile heading.

Late Registration

Beginning the first week of classes, students wishing to add a class will be required to obtain a *Student Add Label* from the instructor of record. The *Student Add Label* contains an authorization code that allows the student to register for the class using the WebAdvisor system. Specific instructions on how to use the authorization code with WebAdvisor is provided by the instructor at the time the *Student Add Label* is acquired.

Students who are not in GOOD standing will not have access to WebAdvisor. Students will need to take their *Student Add Label* with authorization code to the registration office to register.

Other Important Information

Corequisites

Requires that you take simutaneously with another class if not already completed (concurrent enrollment).

Prerequisites

Prerequisite requirements must be met in order to register for classes with a prerequisite. See a counselor for assistance to clear any prerequisite requirement.

Instructor Permission

Classes requiring instructor permission must be cleared by the instructor. Obtain necessary permission from the instructor or division office.

Variable Unit Courses

WebAdvisor: For variable unit courses, you will need to enter the number of units you want to add.

Waiting Lists

Once classes reach their seat capacity, you will be notified that the class is closed and may be given the option to be placed on the waiting list (not all classes have waiting lists). Students are limited to one waiting list per course.

DROPPING A CLASS – Refer to the Enrollment Dates and Deadlines on page 1. Students may drop a class using WebAdvisor or in person. Students not in GOOD standing, or with a monetary hold, must drop a class in person at the campus Admissions and Records office.

It is the student's responsibility to officially drop a class in which he/she no longer wishes to be enrolled.

- Withdrawal from a full-term 18-week class through the end of the third week (prior to the 20 percent point) will result in no entry on the student's permanent record.
- Withdrawal from a full-term 18-week class beginning the fourth week through the ninth week (50 percent point) of instruction will result in an entry of "W" recorded on the student's permanent record.
- Withdrawal from a short-term class will vary based upon the meeting dates of a class. The student will need to obtain these dates from the Instructor An entry of "W" will be recorded on the student's permanent record beginning at the 20 percent point of a class through the 50 percent point of a class.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COLLEGE – A student may withdraw from all of his/her classes, using WebAdvisor provided the student does not have any monetary holds and is in GOOD standing, or in person through the last day of the ninth week for full-term classes (18-week) or the 50 percent point of short-term classes.

The student may also mail or fax a signed letter that must be received on or before the final drop date, to the Admissions and Records office. Mailing address and fax number available at www.fresnocitycollege.edu/admissions-aid/admissions-and-records-office/index.html. Excessive "W's" will be used as factors in progress probation and dismissal.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION

DOUBLE-CHECK everything carefully. The college assumes no responsibility to adjust time conflicts which are the result of the student's own error. The online registration system will catch most time conflicts, but the final responsibility is yours.

Prerequisites/Corequisites/Advisories

Students are urged to study the description of courses in the college's catalog to ensure that prerequisites are satisfied before registering for a course. Correct registration at an early date is important. A prerequisite is defined to mean a condition of enrollment that a student must meet in order to register in a course or program. A student may challenge any prerequisite by completing the Prerequisite/Corequisite Challenge Petition available in the Counseling Center. It is the student's responsibility to be certain that he/she has met the necessary prerequisite(s) for any course he/she wishes to take. The student will be dropped from any class where it is verified that the necessary prerequisite has not been successfully passed. Prerequisites will be validated after final semester grades have been posted. It should be understood by the student that whether or not a prerequisite is specifically stated, the instructional staff of Fresno City College assumes that each student who enrolls in a transfer-level course possesses sufficient competencies in the areas of reading, writing and mathematics to be able to profit from instruction. A corequisite indicates that the course must be taken simultaneously with another course if not already completed. Advisory indicates that the institution recommends, but does not require certain course work be taken prior to enrolling in the described course.

Other Limitations on Enrollment


Enrollment in certain courses or educational programs of study may require tryouts, auditions or may be limited by health and safety considerations, facility limitations, faculty workload, the availability of qualified instructors, funding limitations or legal requirements imposed by statutes, regulations or contracts. All such limitations are in conformity with the provisions of Title 5, Section 58106, California Community College Board of Governors.

WEBADVISOR: REGISTER ONLINE

- Visit <u>www.fresnocitycollege.edu</u> and click on "My Portal".
 Once you log in to your student portal you can access WebAdvisor, and other useful tools.
- All registration and waitlist policies and information apply to WebAdvisor (refer to page 11 for waitlist policies).
- For variable unit courses, the default number of units is 1.
 If you wish to increase the number of units be sure to do so before clicking the submit button. If after registering for the variable unit, you wish to increase or decrease the units, you will need to visit the campus Admissions & Records office for assistance.

- Students will receive add/drop activity to his/her my.scccd.edu email account. You can print your schedule off the WebAdvisor schedule page. You can also get a copy at the Admissions and Records Office.



Important Notice: You must waitlist for all corequisite classes to be considered for registration in a class that requires a corequisite.



Waitlists

Once a section has reached the maximum seat capacity, students may have the option of being placed on a "WAITLIST" for a specific section of the course. NOT ALL CLASSES HAVE WAITLISTS. Please note the following rules apply:

- 1. Students will be added to a WAITLIST on a first-come, first serve basis
- Students cannot be placed on a WAITLIST prior to their registration appointment date.
- 3. Students may add their name to any available WAIT LIST up to the last day of registration prior to the start of the class.
- 4. Students cannot be placed on a WAITLIST for more than one section of the same course.
- Students cannot be placed on a WAITLIST for the same course when already enrolled in another section.
- Students cannot remain on a WAITLIST for a section of a course that will cause a "Time Conflict" with another course sections already enrolled. Admissions and Records will drop the student from the wait list.

- Admissions and Records will regularly monitor all WAITLISTS. As a seat becomes available, the student in the first position of the waitlist will be enrolled into the class, providing all requisites and registration holds are cleared, and will be notified by email.
- Students on a WAITLIST will have first priority for any seats in a "full" class that may subsequently become available during the first 20% of the section PROVIDED that he/she attends each and every class meetings (first 20% period for 18 week sections is the first 3 weeks)
- 9. Students on the WAITLIST must be present the first class meeting, and if the instructor determines there are openings in the class, the students on the WAIT LIST will be offered the seats based upon the order in which their names appear on the list. Students are responsible for officially adding the class section within the published registration dates.

Course Repetition for a Better Grade

Students may repeat a college course, not designated as repeatable, in which he/she has received a grade of D, F, NC/NP, or W, by re-enrolling in the course. Student will be required to complete a "Repeat Petition" at the Admissions and Records office and meet with a counselor before being allowed to register or waitlist for a class, if:

- a. Student has received two (2) failing grades D, F or NC/NP, or
- b. Student has received two (2) W's, or
- c. Student has received a combination of one (1) failing grade and one (1) W.

If a student has received a combination of three(3) or more failing grades and/or W's, he/she will be required to submit a Student Education Plan (SEP) with the "Repeat Petition". Students will be notified of their petition status within 4 days of submission. Note: all 4th attempt petitions are reviewed by the Academic Standards Committee (ASC) or designee. Notification will be sent to the student's my.scccd.edu email account regarding status and final decision.

Key to Graduation or Transfer Status Designations

Listed with the course subject and number, if applicable, are abbreviations identifying the transfer or graduation status of the course. The key to the abbreviations follows:

A Associate degree applicable

CSU Transferable to the California State University system
CSU-GE Meets the general education requirements for the
California State University transfer certification.
Completion of all courses in the California State
University General Education transfer certification
pattern will permit a student to transfer to a campus in
the California State University system without having
to complete additional lower division general
education courses after the transfer.

- I Meets the requirements of the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC).
 Completion of all IGETC requirements will permit a student to transfer to a campus in either the California State University or University of California system without having to complete additional lower division general education courses after transfer.
- UC Transferable to the University of California system.

COUNSELING

Counselors and Educational Advisors are available to assist students during registration and throughout the year.

Educational Transfer Curriculum

Students planning to transfer from a SCCCD institution to a baccalaureate institution should be aware that admissions and major requirements will vary with each university. To ensure appropriate transfer course preparation:

- SEE a counselor to ensure appropriate course planning.
- UTILIZE the college catalog for transfer course planning information: CSU-GE, UC Breadth or the UC/CSU (IGETC) pattern.
- OBTAIN a major sheet describing the general education and major preparation for each college. Go online to fresnocitycollege.edu/counseling. Remember the major sheets are advisory only. Since changes occur frequently, see a counselor to discuss your major and identify any changes that may have occurred in your major and general education preparation.
- WRITE the college or department directly for additional transfer information.

Counseling Required — Academic Status

Counseling is required prior to registration for students on Academic and/or Progress Probation or Special Counseling status. For more information, go to the Counseling Center.

ENROLLMENT FEES*

Student Fees: Enrollment Fee*

Each student pays a per unit enrollment fee. The total amount is determined upon the number of units a student registers for each semester.

California Residents: \$46 per unit (with no cap)

Note: Enrollment fees for California residents are subject to change without notice per the California State Legislature and the Governor. If enrollment fees are raised after you enroll, you will be invoiced for the unpaid difference.

California residents may apply for a Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waiver through the college Financial Aid Office. Effective Fall 2006, the Student Health Fee will no longer be covered by the Board of Governors Fee Waiver.

Out-of-State/International Student Tuition Fees*

Any U.S. resident student that has not established California residency must pay a non-resident fee of \$258 per unit for summer classes. International students must pay a tuition fee of \$258 per unit for summer classes. In addition to the non-resident fee or the tuition fee, an enrollment fee of \$46 will be charged for each unit taken. Check with the Admissions and Records Office for details regarding residency requirements.

Payment of Fees

Summer 2019 fees are due prior to the start of the term

The Business Office will not drop students for non-payment of fees once the class begins. Students are responsible for dropping their own classes. Please see page 14 regarding tuition refund policies.

Note: Financial aid is available for eligible students. See the Financial Aid Office for more information.

Personal Checks*

All personal checks must be imprinted with the name of the account holder. Postdated and two-party checks will not be accepted. Students whose checks are returned by the bank marked "insufficient funds," "stop payment," "account closed," "refer to maker," etc., will be assessed a \$25 service charge. Returned checks can be cleared at the campus Business Office cashier's window with a money order, cashier's check, credit card or cash — personal checks will not be accepted to clear returned checks. Returned checks not paid within 30 days of the date of the NSF notice will be forwarded to a collection agency and will be subject to all associated collection fees. When mailing fees, payment should be mailed to:

Please be sure to write your student ID on your check. Allow enough time for payments to reach the college prior to the due date. The college assumes no responsibility for delays caused by the U.S. Postal Service. Postmarks will not be honored. Students who fail to pay by their scheduled due date may be dropped from their classes.

Credit Card Payment

Students are encouraged to use the online WebAdvisor's "Pay on my account" option to pay their enrollment fees by credit card. If you are unable to login to WebAdvisor, please contact the WebAdvisor Help Desk at 559-442-8240 to obtain

login information. Credit card payments are also accepted at the Business Office's cashier window or over the telephone (see page 4 for phone numbers) during normal business hours at 559-489-2234

Materials Fee - Selected Courses Only

In accordance with the Education Code, State Center Community College District and Fresno City College may require students to provide certain instructional and other materials. These may include, but are not limited to, textbooks, tools, equipment, and special clothing (e.g. uniforms). Such required materials fees may be: (1) The materials are used in the production of a course-related project or "end project" that has a continuing value to the student outside of the classroom setting; or (2) The required materials for use in the class have continuing value to the student outside the classroom setting. Students who wish to purchase instructional materials on their own must secure advance written approval of the instructor and provide such written approval to the Business Office for a waiver of the material fee.

Health Fee

All on-campus students are required to pay a \$17 health fee for the summer term and a \$20 health fee for each semester (fall and spring terms). Off-campus students are required to pay a \$12 health fee for each term (fall, spring, and summer). For students enrolled in both on-campus and off-campus sites the health fee is charged at the on-campus rate. Effective Fall 2006, on-campus sites will include Fresno City College, Reedley College, Clovis Community College, and Madera Community College Center. An exemption/waiver from the health fee is available to the following students:

- Students who depend exclusively upon prayer for healing in accordance with the teachings of a bona fide religious sect, denomination, or organization
- Students who are attending a community college under an approved apprenticeship program.

The Health Fee Waiver form is available online under Current Forms for Students, Resources, Student Business Office Froms.

Parking Fee*

Vehicles must display a State Center Community College District parking permit to park in parking lots at all district locations. The price for a parking permit is \$10 for the summer sessions and \$30 for the fall and spring semesters. Permits can be purchased in the College Business Office. Copies of the campus parking regulations are available at the College Business Office, FCC Bookstore, and the College Police Department.

REFUND FEE POLICY AND SCHEDULE

Refund Fee Processing

It is the student's responsibility, not the instructor's responsibility, to drop a class by the refund/fee reversal deadline. A refund reversal of enrollment, tuition and class material fees shall be made in accordance with the district refund policy. Students are required to submit a refund request form to the College Business Office. Requests may also be submitted online at www.fresnocitycollege.edu by selecting the "Forms Online" quick link and choosing the "Request for Refund" option. Please ensure that all class(es) are dropped before submitting your request. Refund checks may take up to eight weeks to receive.

Refund of Enrollment Fees and Tuition

Refund or reversal of enrollment fees and tuition shall be made following cancellation or withdrawal from class(es) in accordance with the following schedule. Requests may be made in person at the College Business Office OAB 151 or online at http://onlineforms.scccd.edu/reqforrefundfeerev.aspx by selecting the "Forms Online" quick link and choosing the "Request for Refund" option. Refund requests are subject to an audit of the student's record to verify balance. Credit balances may be carried forward to the new term in lieu of a refund and will remain on the books for three years.

Summer/Short Term Classes

State code defines the drop deadlines to qualify for fee refund/ reversals for short-term classes as on or before 10 percent of the duration of the class. A 100% refund is given upon withdrawal by the 10 percent point. No refund is given after withdrawal beyond the 10 percent point.

Refund of Health Fee

Students receive a refund upon complete withdrawal from all classes in accordance with the enrollment and tuition fee refund schedule.

Refund of Parking Fee

Full refunds for parking permits will be made during the first week of the summer session and the first two weeks for the fall/spring semesters upon proof of complete withdrawal from school. The parking permits must be attached to a Request for Refund form and returned to the College Business Office in order to obtain the refund. There is no refund for limited-term parking permits or for plastic holder if purchased.

Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS)

EOPS at Fresno City College offers a comprehensive program for low-income and academically underprepared students. This program includes special orientation, academic and personal counseling, advising, special instruction, career guidance, tutoring, financial aid, college transfer information, book services, emergency loans and other support services. Participants must enroll in a minimum of 12 units.

To be selected for EOPS, a student must apply for Financial Aid. Names of financially eligible students will be selected for evaluation. An EOPS interest card may also be submitted to the EOPS office. EOPS begins accepting applications for Book Services one month prior to the start of each semester. Students are encouraged to apply early to qualify for a grant. For information call 559-442-8231.

Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE)

The CARE program was established as a supplemental component under the requirements and guidelines of EOPS. This unique program provides educational support services and activities for students who meet the following criteria:

- Single head of household
- Receiving TANF/CalWORKs
- Have one child under the age of 14
- Meet the EOPS eligibility requirements
- Enrolled in 12 units or more

Applications can be picked up at the EOPS office.

Veterans

Requests for educational benefits under the G.I. Bill require a separate application for certification. Veterans are reminded that the eligibility period for veterans' benefits is limited to 10 years from their date of separation from active duty. Please also note that the Veterans Administration requires the college or center to decertify a veteran receiving benefits after two consecutive semesters with a GPA below 2.0. For information, call 559-442-8224.

Financial Aid

The majority of our students receive some form of financial aid. Assistance is available to students in need of enrollment fee waivers, grants, loans, part-time jobs and scholarships. For information call 559-442-8245.

IMPORTANT: Federal Financial Aid Recipients

Any federal financial aid recipient totally withdrawing from classes prior to the completion of 60 percent of the semester may be expected to repay all or a portion of any federal financial aid received.

2018-2019 California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the Board of Governors Fee Waiver)

The California Community Colleges offer the California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the Board of Governors Fee Waiver) for students who are California residents and who meet any one of the following three criteria.

- You or your family are receiving public assistance from the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF, formerly AFDC) or supplemental Security Income (SSI) or General certification from the California Department of Veterans Affairs
- 2. You meet the following income standards:

 You have completed the 2019-2020 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and have demonstrated at least \$1,104 of "financial need."

Students can apply for a California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the Board of Governors Fee Waiver) at the Financial Aid Computer Lab in LI-123

Students applying for a summer 2019 California College Promise Grant must complete the 2019-2020 FAFSA application. All students will be charged the health fee of \$16 for summer 2019. The California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the Board of Governors Fee Waiver) does not waive this fee.

Course Repeatability for Financial Aid

- If a student takes a course and does not successfully complete
 it, units for the same course can be included in the calculation
 of his attendance for any subsequent semesters as long as
 the student continues to meet Satisfactory Academic Progress
 standards.
- If a student has passed a course two times and enrolls in the course a third time the units will not be fundable for financial aid. All "D" grades are considered passing for financial aid regardless of institutional policy.
- If a student has passed a course and repeats the course, but receives a failing grade the second time then the student will be ineligible for future funding for that particular course.

The regulations do not allow accommodation for "special courses" or for certain groups of students, such as those with disabilities. All students are treated the same for calculation of attendance status for the federal programs.

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

In May 2008, the Bernard Osher Foundation made a historic gift in the amount of \$25 million to the California Community College system to fund scholarships throughout the state. The Osher Foundation's intention in creating this endowment is to provide scholarships to California Community College students with the greatest need who have demonstrated a commitment to their eduction.

Scholarship criteria:

- 1. Student must have completed 24 or more "degree applicable" semester units (or the equivalent) at the time of the initial scholarship disbursement.
- Student must be enrolled at least half-time (6 or more units) during all terms in which the award remains active.
- 3. Student must have received a CCC Board of Governor's Fee Waiver.
- 4. Awards will be adjusted based on enrolled status.



The Dream Center

The Dream Center (Migrant Student Success Services) is designed to provide information and academic counseling to new and continuing undocumented students at Fresno City College. Counselors and staff assigned to the Dream Center will assist students in overcoming challenges of access and completion of vocational or transfer-level goals in higher education. - 3. Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT). These associate degrees are specifically designed for the student interested in transferring to one of the 23 California State Universities (CSU). Fresno City College offers 22 Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT), please visit the www.fresnocitycollege.edu/transfercenter website to check if your major aligns with one of the ADT degrees. TRIO Programs

In commitment to providing educational opportunity for all citizens, Fresno City College has been awarded two TRIO grants, Upward Bound (UP) and Student Support Services Program (SSSP), which are fully funded by the U.S. Department of Education. These programs assist low-income, first generation students to enter college, graduate and move on to participate more fully and rewarding in America's economic and social life.

Upward Bound Program

The FCC Upward Bound program is an intensive pre-college enrichment program designed to help first generation, economically disadvantaged high school students improve their academic performance, and prepare for college. The long term goal is to pursue careers that require a bachelor's degree or higher. The program provides service conducted at five partnering high schools; Edison, Fresno, Hoover, McLane, and Roosevelt. Bookstore

The Fresno City College Bookstore is operated for the convenience of Fresno City College students. The store carries student supplies, textbooks and other articles of interest to the college community. Return & Refund Policy

Textbooks not in new condition will be given 75 percent (used price) of the original sticker price (receipt required).

- When returning merchandise, students must present their original cash register receipt with the correct dollar amount along with a photo ID. No refund will be given without it. Students have 5 working days from the date on the receipt to return textbooks and 30 days for returnable non-textbook items.
- All sales are final on scantrons, tradebooks/novels and study aides. Various electronics, software and access codes are non-refundable if opened. Access codes that are exposed are also non-refundable.
- A full refund is only given when a class has been cancelled by the College and textbook(s) returned are in the same condition as initially bought. In all other cases, there is a 10% handling/restocking charge.
- 4. Textbook condition: New and used textbooks must be returned in salable condition. Any books damaged by liquids are not returnable. New textbooks must be clean, free of all marks, creases and erasures. If not, the books will be considered "used" and may be refunded at the used price. Wrapped, loose-leaf textbooks, e-books, books with exposed or open access codes and boxed merchandise are non-refundable once opened. Used textbooks are sold "as is." Because these books have been used by other customers prior to sale, the Bookstore cannot guarantee their life expectancy.
- 5. The bookstore reserves the right to make the decision on the condition or salability of all returned merchandise.

Police

Address Change

It is the responsibility of the student to keep their college or center informed of his/her current address. Students can make address changes online at www.webadvisor.scccd.edu.

Class Attendance

A student who does not attend the first meeting of any class for which he/she has registered may be dropped from the class. It is the student's responsibility to make arrangements with his/ her instructor if the first class meeting is missed. Absences from class due to transportation delays, personal and business engagements, or to complete registration or program changes are considered unexcused absences. A student who is continuously absent for two weeks may be dropped by the instructor provided the absences occur prior to the final drop deadline. Students who show a pattern of absences which the instructor considers excessive may also be dropped prior to the final drop deadline provided the instructor has given students notice of this policy in the course syllabus. In accordance with the State Education Code and college policy, no student may be dropped after 50 percent of the class but must receive a letter grade other than a "W." Students who intend to drop a class should do so themselves and not depend on the instructor to drop them for nonattendance. The college and its individual instructors assume no responsibility to change grades assigned to a student as a result of the student's failure to drop a class properly.

Computer/Network Equipment Use Policy

It is understood that information, programs or data a student obtains from the Internet are used at his/her own risk. He/she is responsible for any damage caused by malicious programs, commonly known as viruses, received from the Internet.

Elevator Usage

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act outlines certain rights students have concerning access to and release of their educational records. Grading

Students planning to transfer to a four-year university should be aware of that institution's policy toward P/NP grades before exercising this option.

Probation

Students should be aware of a provision of the state education code which requires that all students maintain satisfactory progress and a 2.0 cumulative grade point average while enrolled at a community college. Excessive "W" marks and "NP" grades, whether initiated by the student or by the instructor, will result in a student being placed on Progress Probation. A cumulative grade point average below 2.0 will result in a student being placed on Academic Probation. If the progress or academic problems continue, the student may face Dismissal. See your college catalog for details.

Study Abroad

Students at Fresno City College, Reedley College, Madera Community College Center, Oakhurst Community College Center, and Clovis Community College may take advantage of international study programs offered by the college district. The international programs allow students an opportunity to study in another country while earning transferable college credit, as well as enable them to gain a first-hand understanding of other regions and cultures of the world.

Costa Rica

While exploring a medicinal plant garden in the Costa Rican rain forest and spotting wildlife in the unique Caribbean canals of Tortuguero, students will discuss and experience first-hand cultural differences and identify ways culture impacts application, acceptance, and availability of healthcare practices. Student Right-to-Know Campus Security Act

In compliance with the Student-Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1991 (Public Law 101-542), it is the policy of the State Center Community College District to make available its completion and transfer rates to all current and prospective students. Beginning in Fall 1996, a cohort of all certificate-, degree- and transfer-seeking, first-time, full-time students were tracked over a three-year period. Their completion and transfer rates are listed below. These rates do not represent the success rates of the entire student population at the State Center Community College District, nor do they account for student outcomes after this three-year tracking period.


Based upon the cohort defined above, 27.5 percent attained a certificate or degree or became 'transfer prepared' during a three-year period from Spring 1996 to Spring 1999. Students who are 'transfer-prepared' have completed 56 transferable units with a GPA of 2.0 or better.

Based on the cohort defined above, 20.9 percent transferred to another postsecondary institution, (UC, CSU, or another California community college) prior to attaining a degree certificate or becoming 'transfer-prepared' during a five-semester period from Spring 1997 to Spring 1999.

ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE

AJ 276

PREREQ: A California Peace Officer Standards and Training Basic Course certificate issued from an accredited regional police academy or equivalent as determined by the Division Dean, Director or their representative. NOTE: Approval of equivalent training is not a guarantee state regulatory or licensing agencies will also grant equivalency. Prior to beginning this course students must already be familiar with, and be able to demonstrate, all of the skills listed below. These will not be taught in the course rather, they will be the starting point for advanced student training that builds upon them. These minimum skill levels are: Course requires extensive knowledge of all types of police operations, because as first line supervisor you must have a wide variety of law enforcement daily operations. The first line supervisor will need to possess deep operational knowledge because in part, he or she will be called upon to make judgments regarding the direction of police operations. Students will also be required to have detailed knowledge of California law, case law, evidence collection, and criminal justice procedures. Knowledge of, and familiarity with, proper use of force during law enforcement operations knowledge of proper use of verbal and non-verbal communication used in law enforcement contacts with the public knowledge of, and familiarity with, current case law related to proper law enforcement procedures in daily policing knowledge of the proper use of police weaponry as it pertains to its use in daily policing knowledge of the rank structure in policing knowledge, and familiarity of, local, state, and federal laws, and policies, pertaining to law enforcement.
