
\$70 million grant for FRESNO through State Cap & Trade




TCC

- Project Requirements: Targeted TCC areas (93701, 93721 and 93706); Adopted City Plan (SWFSP)
- Program process expedited outreach, campus open forums
- Maximize funding of WF through expanded programs for the satellite, possibly including one or more:
 - Auto-Hybrid, Allied Health, General Ed, STEM related programs, Manufacturing, Student Center/Services, CTC Offerings in Applied Tech
- Initial Proposal 9/12/17; Project review 9/27/17; City Workshop 10/12/17; City Submits to SGC 10/18/17




FCC Headcount

FCC Unduplicated Headcount - 10 Years






FCC FTES (Full-time Equivalent Students)

TRANSFORMATIVE CLIMATE COMMUNITIES PROJECT REVIEW DAY

On September 20, Dr. Carole Goldsmith along with SCCCD Trustee Eric Payne presented a proposal for a new satellite compus at the Transformative **Climate Communities Project** Review Day for the City of Fresno. She presented the development and cost of the new satellite campus site in the West Fresno region to provide community residents with access to workforce training and educational opportunities. On October 4, the Fresno Community Steering Committee


