FCC HOSTS ENROLLMENT EXPRESS WITH FPU

On November 8th the Transfer Center coordinated an Enrollment Express event with Fresno Pacific University. FPU brought over 30 staff members to offer FCC students a complete matriculation opportunity including: transcript evaluation, financial aid counseling, on the spot admissions, and course enrollment. Seventy-six Fresno City College students attended with 41 enrolling for Spring 2018 and 18 students enrolling for Fall 2019.

DR. GOLDSMITH RECOGNIZED BY FLYP



ATHLETIC TEAMS SHINE



The Fresno City College men's and women's sports programs are doing extremely well this postseason. The wrestling team captured the California Community College Athletic Association State Team Dual title on Nov. 19th over defending champion Cerritos, 28-11. The top-ranked Rams got victories from Casey Jones, Brandon Bettencourt, Isaiah Perez, Aaron Mora, Dylan Martinez, Victor Vargas and Jay Johnson. The team will be participating in the CCCAA State Championships Dec. 8-9 in Stockton. The men's and women's soccer teams will also be playing for state titles this weekend. The men's team (16-1-6) punched their ticket with a 1-0 win over West Valley College. The women, who are ranked No. 1 in the National United Soccer Coaches Junior College Division III National poll and are undefeated with a 24-0-1 overall record, defeated San Joaquin Delta 2-0. The women's volleyball team entered the playoffs as defending CCCAA state champions. After an opening round win over Solano College, the Rams season came to a close after dropping a tough five set match against visiting San Joaquin Delta on Nov. 25. The football team closed out their season with a resounding 41-21 win over Butte College on Nov. 18 in the State Center Bowl.

HBCU CARAVAN

On November 8th, Fresno City College was one of seven California community colleges to host an HBCU Caravan hosted by the CCC Chancellor's Office. Twenty-two Historically Black Colleges and Universities were represented, and all of them participated in the California Community College HBCU Transfer Guarantee program. Attendees included Fresno City College students, students from other area community colleges and local high school students. The SYM-BAA/IDILE programs and the Transfer Center collaborated in the hosting of this great event.

Biology instructor and tardigrade expert, Carl Johansson, is featured in the December issue of Research Features in the Natural History section regarding his long time fascination and research with tardigrades. Johansson has provided students, many from deprived areas, to

become expert biologists. Students receive training and sound knowledge of research, database management and digital imaging. Tardigrades are little known to science; however, their remarkable ability to enter suspended animation and withstand extreme conditions may support important medical advances.
