HAYWARD AWARD

Dr. Shushanek Silvas, Instructor/ Supervisor in the PASS Center, was selected to receive the 2017-18 Hayward Award that recognizes outstanding community college faculty who have a track record of excellence, both in teaching and in professional activities, and have demonstrated commitment to their students, profession, and college. California Community Colleges, will be presented to Dr. Silvas at the Board of Governors meeting on March 19-20, 2018.

MASTER PLAN FOR HIGHER ED

FCC hosted the Assembly Select Committee on the Master Plan for Higher Education in California on March 1. Assemblymembers Marc Berman, Dr. Joaquin Arambula, Jose Medina and State Senator Bill Allen heard presentations on college affordability, basic needs of students, and ensuring equity and student success from experts in the UC system, the CSU system, and the California State Chancellor's Office.

HBCU SPRING CARAVAN



On February 13th, Fresno City College hosted our 3rd annual Spring HBCU Caravan. Twenty-five Historically Black Colleges and Universities were represented at this event. There were over 150 attendees, including Fresno City College students, students from other area community colleges and local high school students. At the event, \$106,000 in scholarships and 68 admissions were awarded on the spot. The SYMBAA/IDILE programs and the Transfer Center collaborated in the hosting of this great event.

DREAM CENTER WORKSHOPS

The Dream Center is sponsoring a series of workshops this Spring to help their students receive information about services available at regional four-year universities and financial opportunities available to Dreamers. The workshops include services available at UC Merced (March 9) and Fresno State (April 6). The third workshop will present information on paid internships and scholarships (May 4).

UC MERCED PRESENTATION



The exhibit also includes New Mexico artist Judy Chicago, who established the Feminist Art Program at CSU Fresno in 1970.

The 28th Annual City Jazz Festival is slated for Thursday, March 22 at 7:30 pm in the theatre and will feature FCC alumnus and trumpet player Gilbert Castellanos. Students from over 30 junior high and high school music programs will participate in the student performances throughout the

On February 22, FCC participated in the seventh annual Digital Learning Day, a nationwide celebration that highlighted great teaching and technology demonstrations that improve student outcomes.
