1. NON-TRANSFER OPTION\_- The *Associate Degree* requires the completion of the major (31 units) with a “C” or better grade in each course plus the General Associate Degree requirements – basic competencies, physical education/Dance, and lifetime physical and mental wellness – and General Education requirements for a total of **60 semester units minimum** with a 2.0 or better GPA.
