Notes:

- 1. Psychology is the scientific study of human behavior and mental processes. Psychology emphasizes the use of critical thinking and the scientific method to ask questions, acquire and evaluate information, and solve problems. The field recognizes the complexity of human behavior, and is guided by the idea that a complete understanding of human behaviors, emotions, and thoughts must include an analysis of factors as diverse as biological, interpersonal, and sociocultural influences. Thus, psychology represents a method of inquiry that can be a useful tool for students with a variety of interests and career goals.
- 2. The Associate Degree requires completion of the major (22 units) with a "C" or better grade in each course. Students must complete one of the three different general education patterns: option 1 Fresno City College General Education, option 2 CSU GE Breadth– California State University General Education, OR option 3 IGETC Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum for a total of 60 semester units minimum with a 2.0 or better GPA.
