PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Respiratory Care Practitioners (RCPs) are a vital part of the medical community. Under the direction of a physician, RCP's work to evaluate, treat, and care for patients of all ages with heart and lung disorders. The responsibilities and skill sets for RCP's range from assisting in the treatment of a patient with asthma and/or chronic lung disease to initiating and managing lifesaving modalities. Graduates are prepared for employment providing direct patient care as part of the health care team. The program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (COARC).

REQUIREMENTS TO SUBMIT A PROGRAM APPLICATION:

After completing all the prerequisites above and program application requirements, students may complete and submit a Program Application for the Respiratory Care Practitioner Program lottery during an application period.

Students will be selected by a randomized lottery. Selected applicants will begin the program in the summer session with enrollment in RCARE 101. This introductory course provides students with a more detailed overview of the program and the opportunity to explore the profession.

After successful completion of RCARE 101, interested students will be enrolled in the next available Fall cohort. If demand exceeds spaces available, then students could be placed on a waitlist.

Application requirements:

- Complete all program prerequisites above, with a letter "C" or better grade.
- Have a minimum cumulative college grade point average (GPA) of 2.50 or higher.
- There are no restrictions as to age, gender, marital status, or race.

The above recommended course sequence satisfies the major preparation/prerequisites and FCC local general education requirements.

*AHLTH 100 is a recommended, but not required, course for this program.

General Education Requirements: It is **strongly** recommended that any remaining degree and GE requirements be taken before beginning the program. Students find that because of the heavy workload, they do not have time for additional course work.

In addition to all courses required for the Respiratory Care major and licensure, students must complete one of the three different general education patterns: option 1 – Fresno City College General Education, option 2 – CSU GE Breadth—California State University General Education, OR option 3 – IGETC – Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum with a minimum of 60 semester units with a 2.0 or better GPA. In order to be eligible to apply to the Respiratory Care Practitioners Program students must have minimum cumulative college grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher.

FCC currently uses a computerized lottery selection process for admission into the Respiratory Care Practitioner Program. The lottery process is used in response to more eligible applicants than enrollment space. All program application requirements, program requirements, selection criteria, and application dates are subject to change. Changes can be found on the FCC website. It is the student's responsibility to stay current with these criteria and requirements. Applicants will enter the lottery pool based on the current application requirements within the application period in which the student is applying, not the catalog of initial or subsequent FCC registration.

NOTES:

- 1. If a transfer level math course has already been completed, this will meet application and graduation requirements for Math content.
- 2. To apply to the program, it is the applicant's responsibility to complete the online Program Application and submit all necessary documents, along with all college transcripts, by the deadline.
- 3. Applicants and Respiratory Care students must keep the Respiratory Care Office informed of any changes in name, address, and telephone number. Failure to maintain accurate information may result in loss of application or admission status.
- 4. Applicants should have no physical or emotional impairment that would preclude the performance of all duties in the program. Successful completion of the program requires applicants to be in good physical and mental health.
- 5. All students who are accepted into an Allied Health program will be required to have a background check. Results from the drug screening can affect qualification to participate in the program.
- 6. State and/or national licensing boards protect the public by screening applicants for licensure in order to identify potentially unsafe practitioners. Applications may be denied to persons convicted of certain crimes that may relate to professional practice. In addition, persons impaired by alcoholism, drug abuse and/or emotional illness are expected to voluntarily seek diagnosis and treatment for any suspected illness. Students with concerns in these areas should discuss them with the appropriate licensing body before entering FCC health programs. The appropriate licensing offices are listed online at FCC Respiratory Care or you may contact the Allied Health, Physical Education & Athletics Division Office for assistance.
- 7. Academic and Professional Requirements can be found in the current Respiratory Care Practitioner Program Student Handbook.
- 8. Classes, clinical training, and related activities are conducted on the FCC campus and at off campus sites affiliated with the program. Students must provide their own transportation. It must be noted that in addition to local clinical facilities, the program has clinical facilities located in Hanford, Tulare, Porterville, Visalia, Selma, Reedley, and Valley Children's Hospital in Madera.
- 9. State License: The successful completion of the RCP Program requires the completion of the Associate in Science degree. Graduates are then eligible to take the national licensing examinations.

Respiratory Care Practitioner (RCARE) Courses: All RCARE courses in the program are taken as a block; that is, all students take the same courses each term.
