**Notes:**

1. Music majors should enroll in Music Theory and Ear Training each semester. Students should begin the course sequence starting in first fall semester enrolled. (Music Theory: MUS 1A or 1AE/1B/2A/2B; Ear Training: MUS 7A/7B/7C/7D.)
2. Music majors should enroll in Applied Music each semester. Students should select the appropriate Intermediate/Advanced or Applied Music Masterclass and Lessons course based on their chosen performance specialty. (ex. brass, guitar, percussion, piano, strings, voice, woodwind)
3. Music majors should enroll in an Ensemble each semester. (ex. band, choir, jazz combo, orchestra)
4. Some of the above courses may have prerequisites. See the catalog or schedule of classes.
5. All students interested in a music major should read the catalog and consult with music faculty and a counselor as soon as possible.
6. Some of the above courses may have prerequisites. See the catalog or schedule of classes.
7. The Associate Degree requires completion of the major (24 units) with a "C" or better grade in each course. Students must complete one of the three different general education patterns: option 1 – Fresno City College General Education, option 2 – CSU GE– California State University General Education, OR option 3 – IGETC – Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum for a total of **60 CSU transferable semester units minimum** with a 2.0 or better GPA.
