



Steps to SUCCESS

Complete steps 1-3 to be fully matriculated and be eligible to register during the preferred enrollment period.

STEP 1:

Apply for Admission and Setup Student Accounts

- **Apply online:** visit www.fresnocitycollege.edu/apply and submit an application through CCCApply.
- **Log in to your student portal:** visit www.fresnocitycollege.edu and click on "My Portal". Once you log in to your student portal (see back of this page), you can access your student email, Canvas, WebAdvisor, and other useful tools. Check your email daily as email is the primary way the college will communicate with you.

STEP 2:

New Student Orientation

- **Complete the Fresno City College Online Orientation** at www.scccd.edu/orientation or through your student portal. You will need to know your SCCCD login information (see back of this page) to enroll in the course and complete this orientation. It may take 1 to 2 business days to clear your orientation hold.

STEP 3:

See a Counselor (Complete SEP) and understand your placement

Meet with an FCC counselor to select the appropriate level of classes to enroll in. For students whose first language is not English, students can take the English for Multi-Lingual Students (EMLS) placement test to determine which course is most appropriate for their skill level. Visit the Assessment Center website at www.fresnocitycollege.edu/assessmentcenter for more details.

- **First-time/transfer students:** after completing Steps 1 and 2, you will be eligible to receive advising to plan your semester Student Educational Plan Abbreviated (SEPA). Contact the College Relations Office at (559) 442-8225.
- **Returning students:** to complete or update your Student Educational Plan (SEP), call the Counseling Department at (559) 442-8226 for an appointment or go online at www.fresnocitycollege.edu/counseling.



STEP 4:

Financial Aid/Scholarships

- **Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** at www.fafsa.ed.gov or the **California Dream Act application** at dream.csac.ca.gov. If you need assistance, visit the Financial Aid Lab in the Library, Room 123.
- **For more information** about scholarships, important deadlines, and financial aid contact information, visit www.fresnocitycollege.edu/financialaid.

STEP 5:

Register for Classes

- **You can register** in the following ways:
 - Online using the WebAdvisor app in your student portal.
 - On-campus in the Admissions Office (Student Svs Bldg, 1st flr)
- **Before you register,** make sure all prerequisite requirements have been met. If the prerequisite was taken and successfully completed outside of the SCCCD campus sites, bring your transcripts indicating the passing grade to the Counseling Department for review.

STEP 6:

Follow Up

- **Pay your student fees:** visit www.fresnocitycollege.edu/fees or the WebAdvisor app in your student portal to pay your fees by the deadline.
- **Get your FCC Photo ID** (optional): go to the Student Activities Office located next to the Cafeteria, cost is \$5 per semester.
- **Get your textbooks:** preview which textbooks are required and purchase or rent from the FCC Bookstore which is located across from the Cafeteria: www.fresnocitycollege.edu/bookstore.
- **Attend your classes** on the first day of school. You may be dropped from class if you fail to attend the first class meeting.
- **Follow up with a counselor** to develop a comprehensive SEP (SEPC).

Application/Student Login Instructions for SCCCD Students

To apply, go to scccd.edu/apply and click on the link for the college where you plan to enroll

- Scroll down and click on the CCCApply link. If you do not have an OpenCCC account, click on "Create an Account" and follow the steps to create an account.
- Once you have created your OpenCCC account, click on the "Start New Application" link. Select the term you are applying for and complete the application process, making sure to check that each section is complete before you press "Submit".
- After you have submitted your application, you will receive two emails to the personal email address you provided: the first from CCCapply confirming your account/application, and the second from SCCCD with your student ID number. It may take up to two business days to process your application.
- Once your application has been processed and you have received your student ID number by email, all future emails will be sent to your SCCCD email. See below for instructions on how to use your ID number to log in to your student portal, which gives you access to your email, WebAdvisor, Canvas, and more.

Next Steps CHECKLIST

Registering for classes is an important step in becoming a student at FCC, but there is still plenty to do after registration to prepare for the beginning of the semester. Here are some things you can do before classes start:

1. **CHECK YOUR SCCCD EMAIL DAILY**
Your email is the primary method the college uses to send you important information including financial aid, registration eligibility, and deadlines. To access your email, login through the FCC student portal. For login instructions, visit sccd.edu/studentlogin.
2. **APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS**
Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.ed.gov or the California Dream Act application at dream.csac.ca.gov. If you need assistance, visit the Financial Aid Computer Lab in the Library (LI-123). Additional scholarships and aid may be available, visit fresnocitycollege.edu/financialaid for more information.
3. **PAY YOUR STUDENT FEES**
Even if your tuition is covered by financial aid, there may be additional costs such as the health or ASB fee. Check the fee amount owed and the deadline in WebAdvisor or visit fresnocitycollege.edu/fees for more information, including how to submit your payment.
4. **CHECK YOUR WAITLIST STATUS**
If you are waitlisted for a class during registration, make sure to check your SCCCD email daily for a "Permission to Register" message. You will have four days (including weekends) to enroll in the class using WebAdvisor under the *New Student Links* section, then *Manage my Waitlist*.
5. **GET YOUR STUDENT ID***
Your student ID has many benefits! Purchase your ID card in the Business Office located in the Old Administration Building (OAB-151) and take your student ID picture in the Student Activities Office (next to the Cafeteria).
6. **PURCHASE YOUR PARKING PERMIT***
If you need to park on campus, make sure to purchase a parking permit in the Business Office located in the Old Administration Building (OAB-151).
7. **PURCHASE YOUR BOOKS AND SUPPLIES***
Visit the Fresno City College bookstore online through fresnocitycollege.edu/bookstore or on campus across from the cafeteria. You can use your printed class schedule to help you search and buy your books before classes start.
8. **PRINT YOUR CLASS SCHEDULE**
Your class schedule includes the class name, date, time, location, and instructor's name. Make sure to print it before the semester begins in WebAdvisor, under the *New Student Links* section, on the left hand side.
9. **SIGN UP FOR RAM READY**
Ram Ready is Fresno City's new student welcome event where you will receive all of the information and services that you need to start your semester. You will be emailed during the summer when sign ups are available.

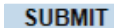
Follow these step-by-step instructions to register for your classes.

Step 1: Log in to My Portal on your college's website. For login instructions, visit scccd.edu/studentlogin

Step 2: Select WebAdvisor from the apps menu. Once in WebAdvisor, click Log In, then click 

Step 3: Click on Address, Email, and Phone Update to update your contact info


Step 4: Under the New Student Links section, click Search/Register for Classes

Step 5: Enter in the Term (Fall 2020), Subject, Course Number, and Location. Click 

You can enter in additional information to narrow your search such as days, start time, etc., but the fields listed above are required. **You can find the Subject and Course number on your SEP**


Step 6: Check the full class information to avoid registration errors by clicking the blue "Section Name and Title."
This will show additional lab times or important class notes located at the bottom of the class detail page.

Financial Aid HELPFUL HINTS

STEP 1 – THE FAFSA

1. Visit fsaid.ed.gov and **create your FSA ID**. An FSA ID is the username and password you'll use to complete and sign your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
2. Your parent should create their own FSA ID. This will let them electronically sign your FAFSA. (Undocumented parents can't create an FSA ID – they'll sign your FAFSA on a paper form.)
3. Visit fafsa.gov and **complete your FAFSA**, as early as October 1 for the following school year. Be sure to add FCC (school code: 001307) to your FAFSA so we get your information!

Need help? Visit the Fresno City College Financial Aid Computer Lab for assistance. They're in the Library building, room LI-123 and are open Monday-Friday, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (closed 12-1 p.m.)

STEP 2 – COMPLETE YOUR FILE

STEP 1 – THE DREAM ACT APPLICATION

(for undocumented students)

1. Visit dream.csac.ca.gov and **create your account**. Create a username and password.
2. A Personal Identification Number (PIN) will be created for your parent at the end of your Dream Act Application. This will allow your parent to electronically sign your Dream Act Application.
3. Visit dream.csac.ca.gov and **complete your Dream Act Application**, as early as October 1 for the following school year. Be sure to add FCC (school code: 00130700) to your Dream Act application so we get your information!

CARE is a unique educational program geared toward the welfare recipient who desires a job-relevant education to break the dependency cycle. The program assists academically under prepared, low income, single household/parent (as determined by County Social Services) who receives cash aid for themselves and/or their child.

Eligibility

- Must meet all EOPS requirements
- Be the single head of household (as determined by the county)
- You or your child must be receiving cash aid (TANF/CalWorks)

Disabled Students Programs and Services staff are committed to creating an accessible learning community where individuals with disabilities have an equal opportunity to pursue their educational goals. We strive to empower students, foster independence, and promote achievement through self-advocacy.

Eligibility

- Documentation from an appropriate licensed professional such as a doctor, nurse practitioner, psychiatrist, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, ophthalmologist, audiologist, licensed speech professional, or neurologist
- Existing documentation from a medical facility or another public or private non-profit agency serving people with disabilities such as Department of Veteran's Affairs, Department of Rehabilitation, Independent Living Center, or disability specific agency
- An Individual Education Plan (IEP) that was developed in high school, including any documentation or testing that was used to determine eligibility for the IEP
- A 504 Plan that was developed in high school, along with any medical documentation or testing that was used to determine eligibility
- Personal observation by a certificated DSP&S staff member in conjunction with the student self-report, may verify the existence of an observable disability
- Learning disability eligibility testing may be available for those who suspect that they have a learning disability, but who have not been formally assessed

EXTENDED OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

EOPS is a comprehensive program that assists low-income and academically disadvantaged students pursuing academic and vocational goals that require additional financial and academic assistance.

Eligibility

- Be a resident of California or eligible for AB540 or DREAM Act
- Qualify for the California College Promise Grant (formerly BOGW) "A", "B" or "C with \$0 Estimated Family Contribution"
- Enrollment in at least 12 units (9 units for NextUp students) for the semester in which you are applying (unit exceptions for verified DSPS students)
- Completed fewer than 45 college units
- Meet one of the following EOPS educational factors:
 - a. Initial eligibility must be below degree level English or below degree level math
 - b. Have not graduated from high school or have not obtained the GED
 - c. Graduated from high school with a GPA below 2.50 on a 4.00 scale
 - d. Previously enrolled in remedial/developmental education

- Be enrolled in at least 9 units

SSSP serves 160 participants each project year.

Eligibility

- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, or meet residency requirements to receive federal student financial assistance
